RESEARCH EXPERIENCE

Primary Researcher, Gettysburg College, 2020 - Present

My current research explores the intersection of internet technologies and interpersonal interactions within social networks among young adults. Specifically, I am examining the impact that the abrupt transition to remote learning, primarily digital communication, and forced computer-mediated relationships that manifested during COVID-19 had on research participants' perceptions of online privacy, identity, community, and its lasting implications.

Primary Researcher, Gettysburg College, 2018 - 2020

My digital media scholarship explored the implications of the integration and normalization of online communication technologies in the lives of Millennials and Gen Z. I sought to understand the impact of strategic surveillance by corporate media platforms to collect, distribute, manage and utilize individual level data on participants' perceptions of privacy, individual identity representation, and group affiliation.

Primary Researcher, Concord University, 2014 - 2017

Research focused on how online technologies are used to negotiate, establish and maintain interpersonal relationships. The data indicates a normalization of technological communication in social interactions leading to expectations of hyper-connection.

My mixed methods research examined the role communication technologies play in interpersonal and family relationships in a comparison study between college students from a historically marginalized rural population and those from a privileged urban background.
