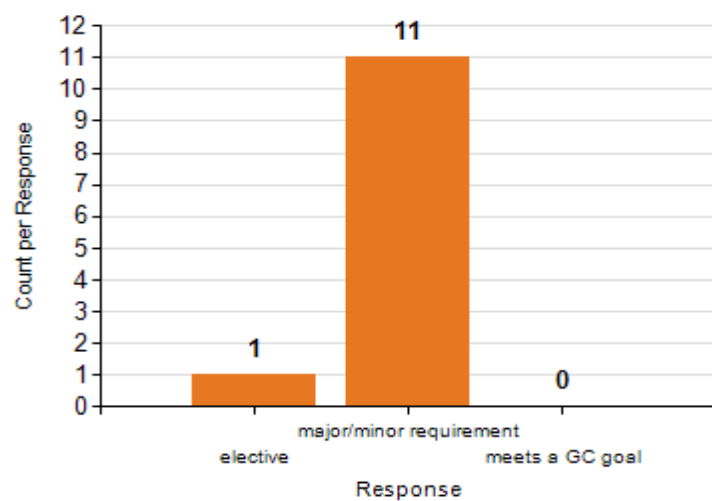

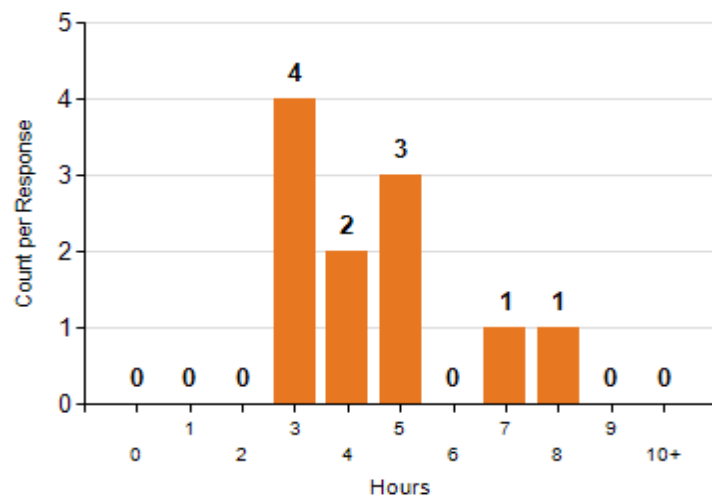

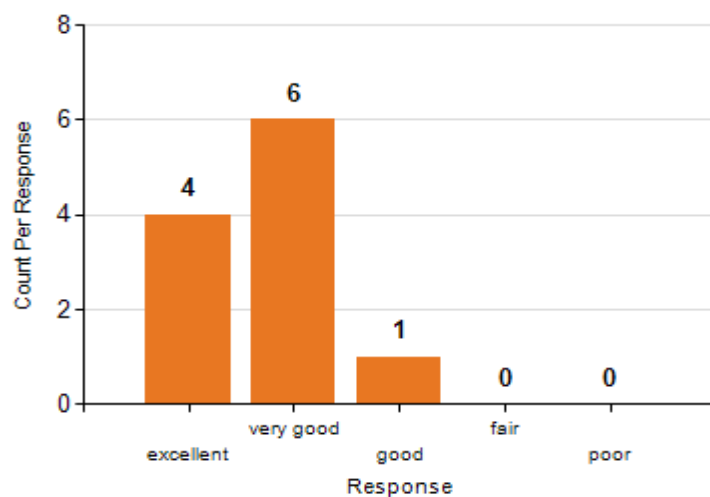
Q1 - Why did you take this course? (Student can select up to 3 responses)

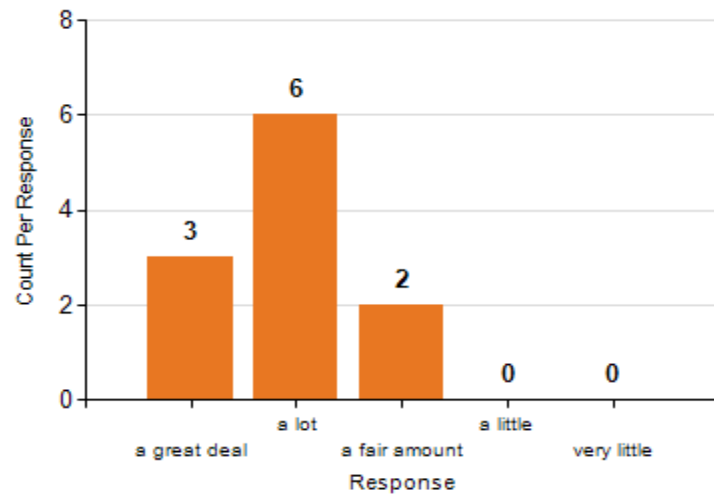

Q4 - How much do you think you've learned from this course?

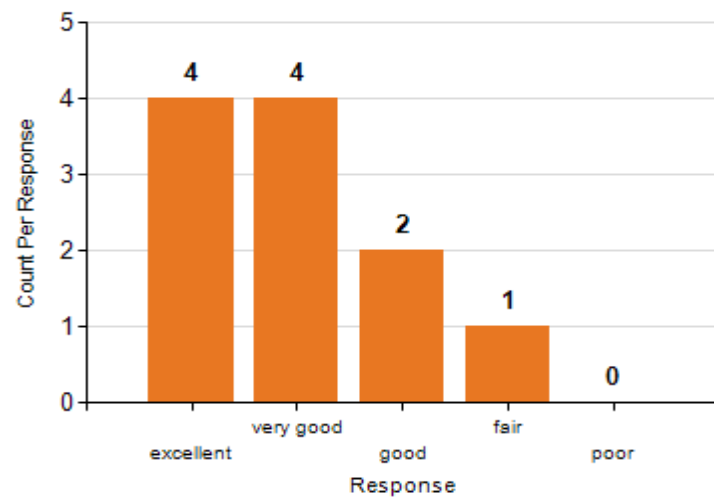

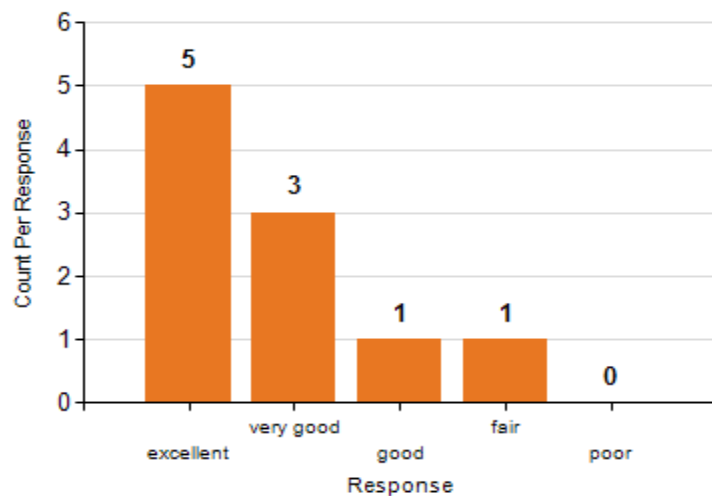

Q6 - How effective was the instructor in conducting class sessions?



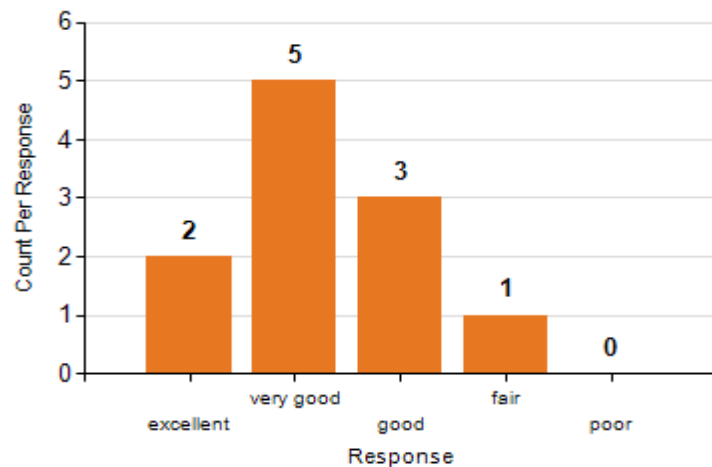

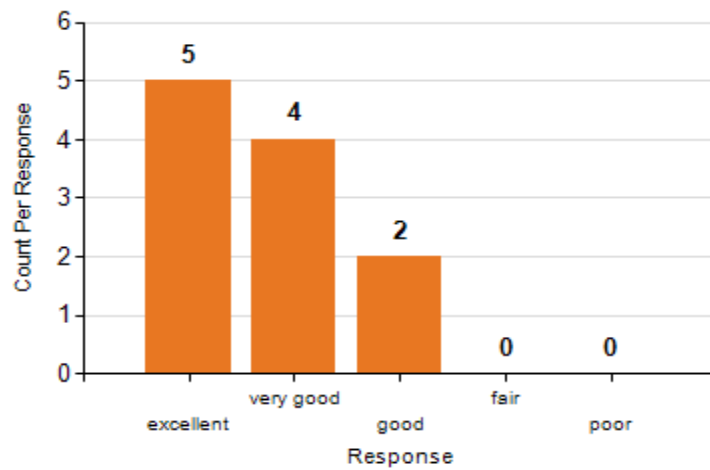

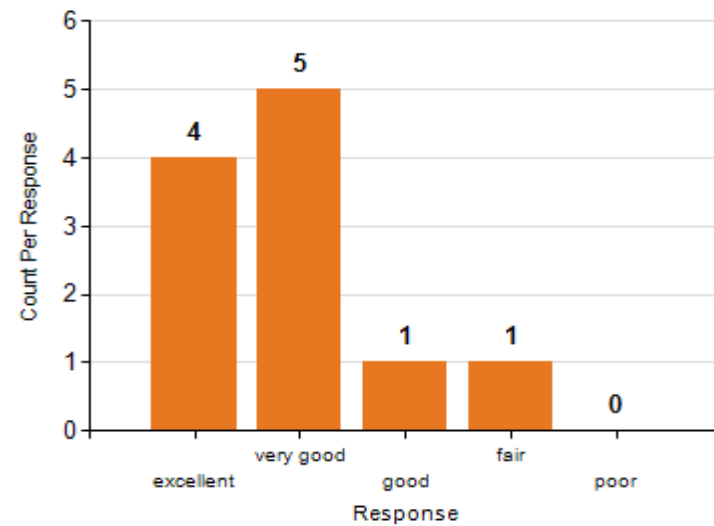

Q9 - What is your overall rating of this instructor?



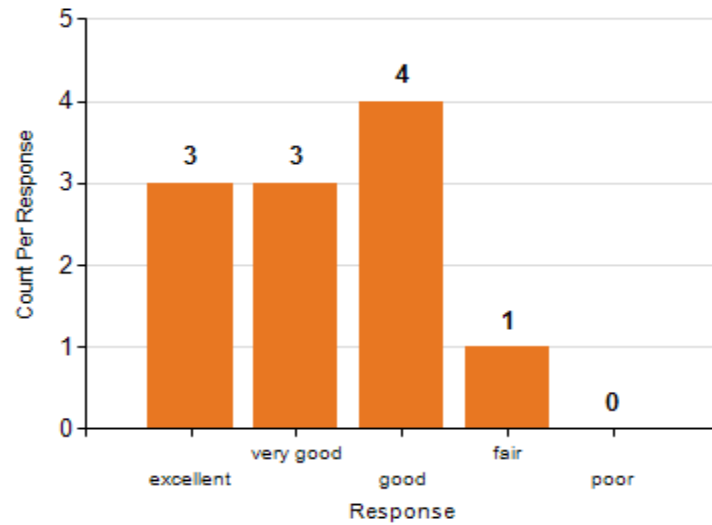
