

Mid-Term Project – Sociology 101
Mid-term Project Due Friday, Oct 23 on the Blackboard site.

Visual Essay:

Using presentation software (such as PowerPoint) or other form of presentation, incorporate photos and text to create a visual essay expressing the way power, privilege and social inequalities are visible in the world around you. Your slideshow should contain at least 20-25 images and include at least 25 words of text for each photo. You will also include a brief project statement.

Project Statement:

The project statement provides an insight into your thought processes and decisions during the construction of your visual essay. In 1-2 page essay, address the following questions in a cohesive statement (i.e. do not answer each question individually):

- What is your central argument or theme?
- How do your images and text support your argument?
- What assumptions do you hold about the issues of inequality you are discussing?
- How does your essay address the implications and ethics of social inequality?

Tips for Success:

- ❑ Remember that you are trying to “write” with these images—your visual essay should have a beginning, middle, and end.
 - The first few images should set up your argument in the clearest way possible, the middle images provide details, and the final images offer a conclusion.
- ❑ You may add up to 100 words of text per image. You can write the text, or it can be a quote from readings we have done in class or from any other text.
 - However, the text cannot simply be a description of the image, or the image an illustration of the text.
 - Rather, the interaction between image and text should encourage the viewer to think about how image and text relate to one another and make a cohesive argument.
- ❑ Remember to carefully proofread your written work and make sure to cite any quotes or references to the text.

Turning in your Work
